Habitat for Humanity of Metro Denver (Habitat Metro Denver) is part of a global, nonprofit housing organization that seeks to put God's love into action by bringing people together to build homes, communities, and hope. Habitat for Humanity was founded on the conviction that everyone needs an affordable, healthy and stable place to live in dignity and safety, and that affordable housing should be a matter of conscience and action for all.

To achieve our vision of a world where everyone has a decent place to live, Habitat Metro Denver builds, renovates and sells homes in partnership with low- and moderate-income families. The organization also works with existing low-income homeowners in formerly red-lined Denver neighborhoods to do critical home repairs. Throughout its 42-year history, Habitat Metro Denver has served more than 2,500 households and is the 8th largest producer in the Habitat U.S. network.

Core Construction Volunteer Position Description

General Description: Core Construction Volunteers make an ongoing commitment to Habitat's construction programs, which include New Construction, Home Repair, Renovation, and the Production Shop. Volunteers gain construction skills and leadership skills working alongside staff, homeowners, and other volunteers.

Major Responsibilities:

- Become a Habitat for Humanity ambassador to our daily volunteers and community members by embracing our Cultural Blueprint
- Perform a variety of construction tasks as directed by staff and AmeriCorps members
- Model appropriate construction techniques and safety procedures
- Sign in with staff at the start of each build day
- Support and promote Habitat's mission on construction sites and in our community

Time Commitment: 2 build days per month or 24 days a year

Knowledge, Skills, & Abilities:

- No construction experience necessary!
- Patience, flexibility, and willingness to learn
- Ability to work outdoors in the elements for extended periods of time
- Ability to stand, bend, kneel or sit for extended periods of time
- Comfortable on uneven ground and sometimes loud working conditions
- Ability to pass background check

Training:

- Habitat Orientation
- Safety practices and procedures
- Tool safety trainings
- All other training will be provided on the job

Location: Build sites throughout Metro Denver area
