Please note:

- If you have an unrelated open or pending charge that is on the not-accepted list, you may not complete your hours with Habitat Metro Denver.
- If you are completing hours for a diversion or pending court case, the charge at your initial arrest must be in the "Accepted" category.
- Habitat Staff have the right to dismiss a volunteer or to not accept a volunteer for any reason, at their discretion.
